Slower recovery despite favourable macro conditions

- Our markets are supported by lowered base interest rates, higher disposable income and a pent-up demand for housing
- Increasing demand from customers but still long time to convert to binding contracts, especially in Sweden
- Increasing activity also in the investor segment
- General uncertainty creates a head-wind for a broader and faster market improvement



Growing business volume and improving result

- Units in ongoing production 3,836 (2,964) with a stable sales rate of 57 (54) per cent
- Improved operating EBIT margin of 6.8 (2.7) per cent, 5.9 per cent on R12
- Estimated surplus value in landbank of SEK 5.3 Billion
- Solid financial position
- Updated guidance for 2025: operating EBITmargin increased from 5-6 per cent to about 6 per cent

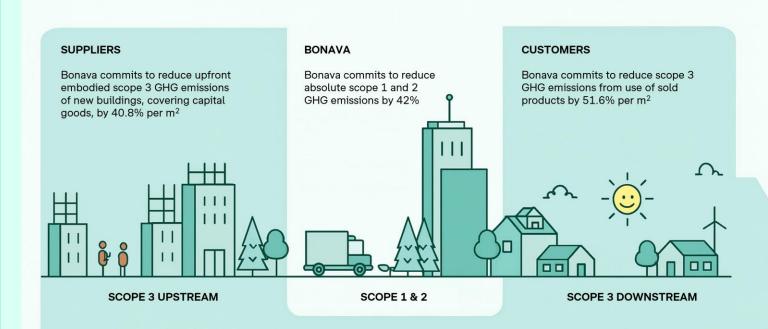

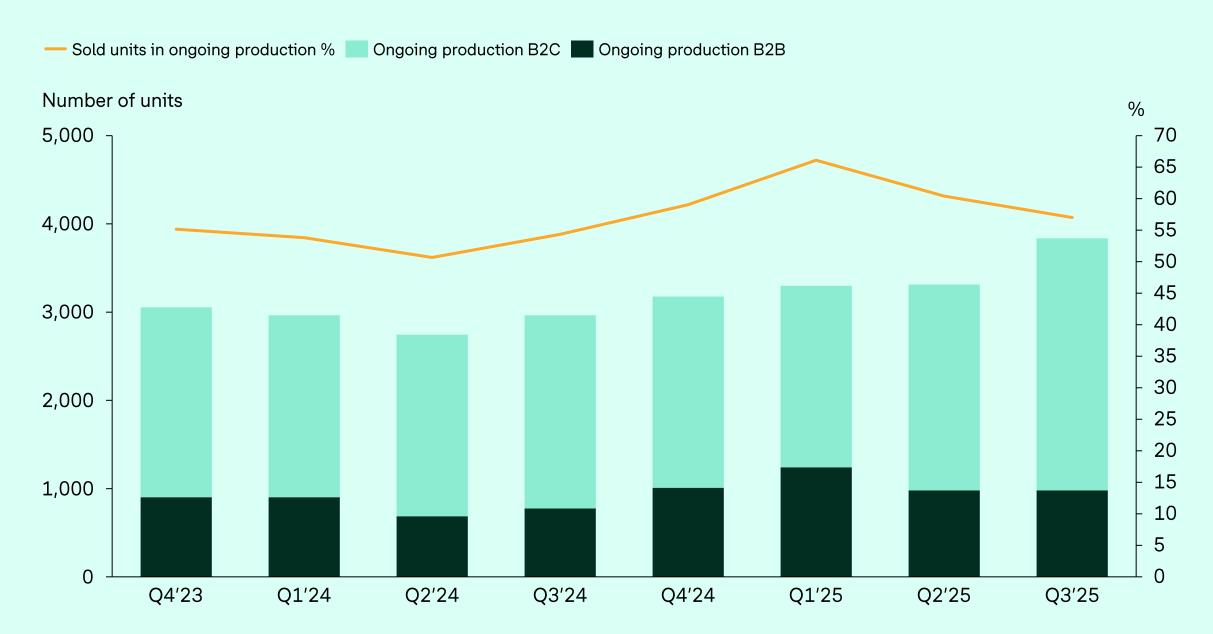
2030 targets vs. 2024 base year



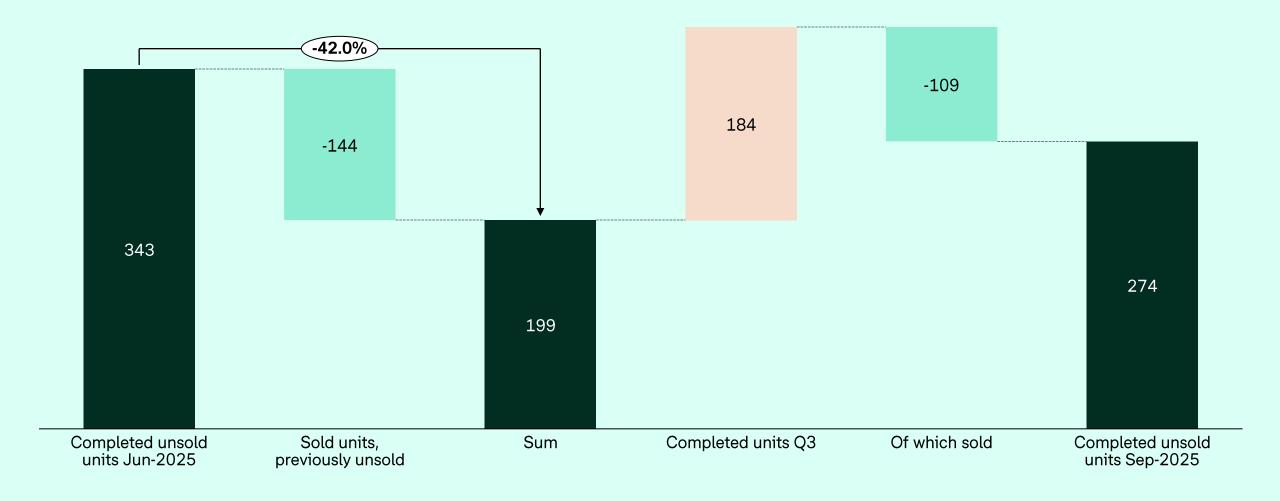
Bonava commits to install no new fossil fuel equipment that is owned or financially controlled by the company in its building portfolios from July 1, 2030.

Growing units in ongoing production with good sales rate

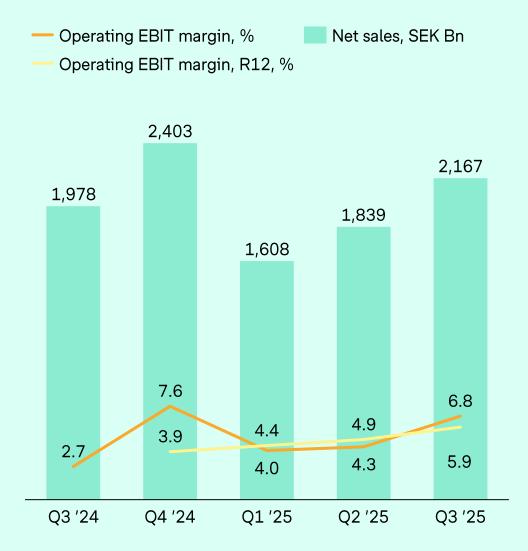


Number of completed unsold units decreasing



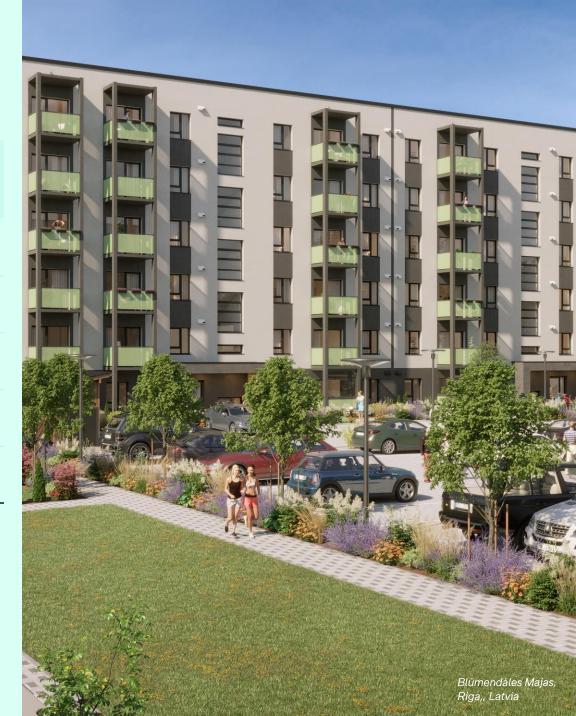

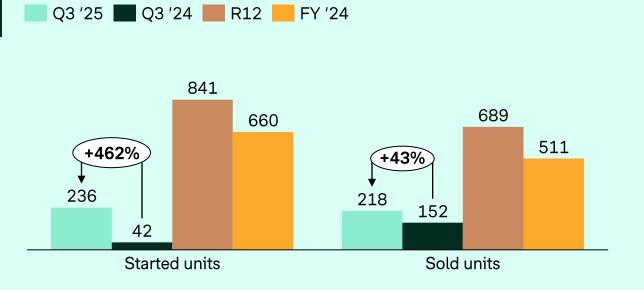

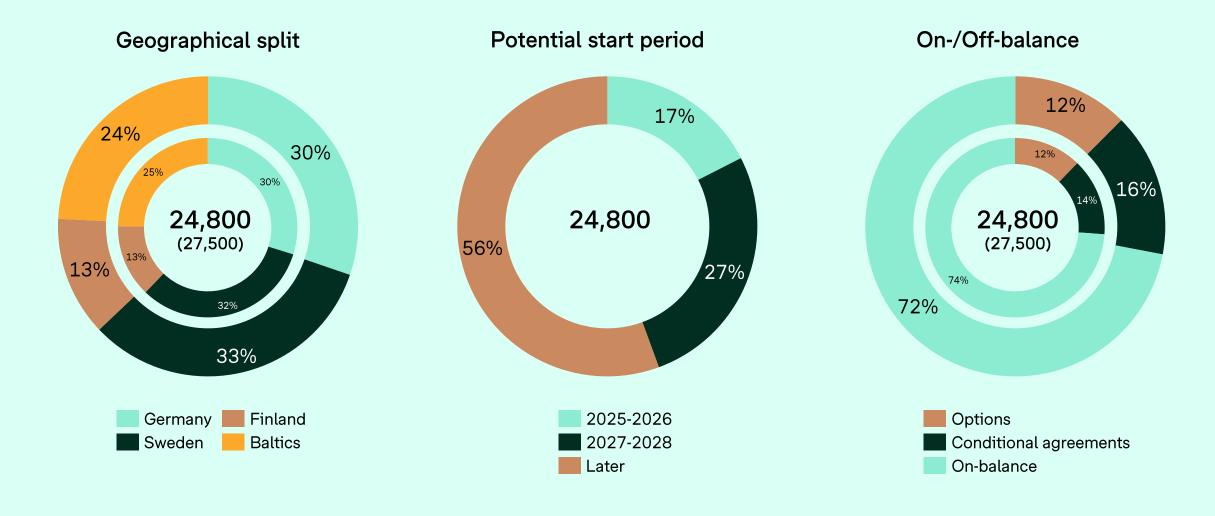

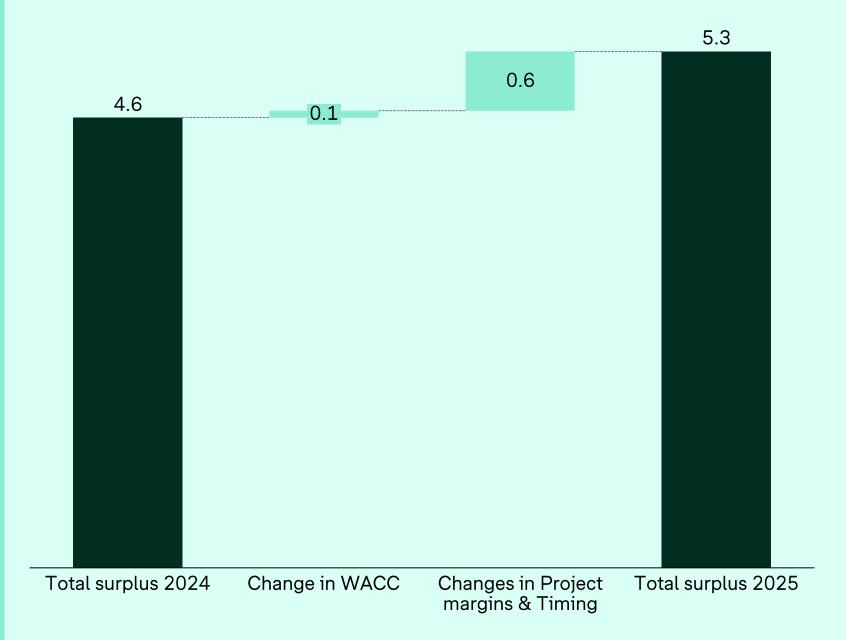


Building rights portfolio – new starts reducing number of building rights

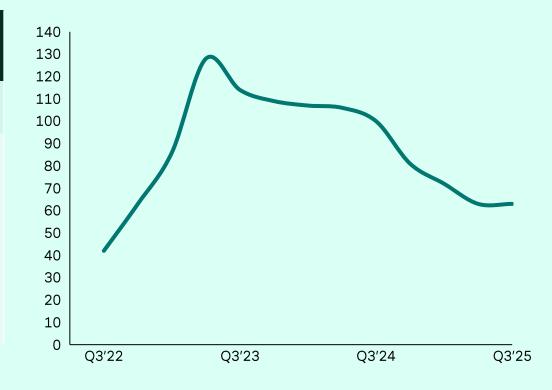

Net interest expenses per quarter (SEK M)

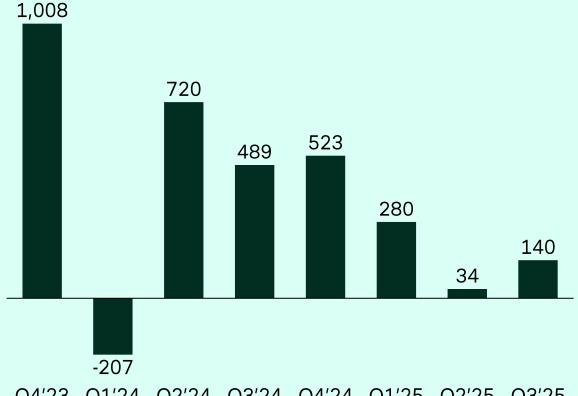

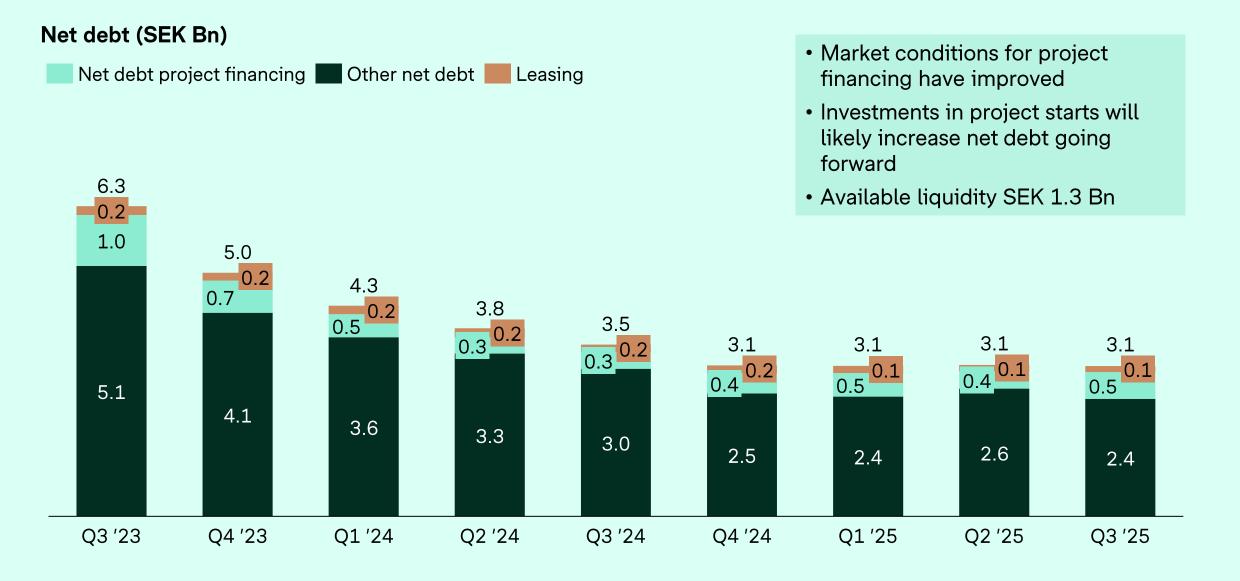

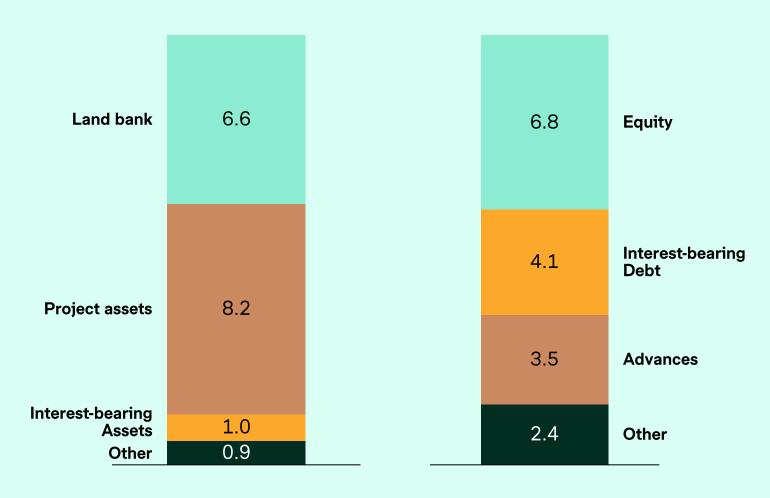
